



**Watford Field School Infant & Nursery**  
**PE and Sport Premium Funding 2015-16**

The Government provides additional funding for Physical Education (PE) and sport in schools. This funding is to be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision resulting in increased numbers of pupils developing healthy and active life styles.

Watford Field School will receive £8000 plus an extra £5 per pupil in Year 1 and Year 2 (89 pupils = £445) and will be used to ensure PE and sport is at the heart of school life to raise achievement for all young children.

As a school our key priorities in developing our PE and sport provision is to:

- Supply additional training for teachers to ensure outstanding PE teaching and learning.
- Increase pupils' participation in a variety of sports and physical activities.
- Improve resources to support the development of the subject

This has led to an increase in staff confidence in the teaching of certain elements of gymnastics and therefore improved the quality of teaching and learning.	Continue to take part in the School Sport Partnership with a particular focus on introducing new sporting activities, staff training and development of coaching programme.
		Training for all teaching staff in the teaching of multi sports. All of the staff who have received the training were very positive about the experience and the children's enjoyment of the lessons has shown that this training was a success.

The children were then given the opportunity to take part in a variety of sporting activities reflective of the games. This increased children's knowledge of sporting activities available to them and gave them an understanding of the Olympic Games and how they could become involved.
