The Government provides additional funding for Physical Education (PE) and sport in schools. This funding is to be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision resulting in increased numbers of pupils developing healthy and active life styles.

Watford Field School has received £8000 plus an extra £5 per pupil in Year 1 and Year 2 and will be used to ensure PE and sport is at the heart of school life to raise achievement for all young children

The school has engaged in the School Sports Partnership for 2016-2017 to continue to develop high quality teaching and pupil engagement in a range of PE and sport opportunities. The cost for academic year is £6,200.
