WHAT WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

Nursery

This week we have been reading Rosie's Walk, we have been using and following positional language in, on, under, next to and behind. We have also been responding to who and where questions when talking and sharing books together. In our Role Play area we have added a pretend hot chocolate café.

Reception

This week, we focused on learning about owls and their features. We named and discussed the basic parts of an owl. We also explored what owls look like and learned that they can turn their heads up to 270 degrees. In Énglish, we planned and wrote our own Owl Fact sheet. In Maths, we practiced comparing objects using the terms wider, fatter, thicker, and thinner.

Year 1

In English, we have been innovating our class story of 'Stick Man' by changing the main character and the characters they see along the journey. In Maths we looked at 'equal to' using balancing scales. In Science, we tested which materials would be best for a pair of curtains. In Computing, we learnt how to turn the Chromebooks on and login with a password.

Year 2

This week Year Two has been full of wonderful learning! The chidren have worked incredibly hard on innovating our class story, using a wide variety of punctuation to make their writing exciting and expressive. In maths, we have been exploring the inverse of calculations, using bar models and part—whole models to help us understand how numbers are connected. During RE, we learned about what God means in the religion of Judaism, having thoughtful discussions and making links to our previous learning. In science, we checked in on our bulb investigation and were delighted to see some small green shoots beginning to appear — a fantastic sign that our observations are paying off!

WHAT WE WILL BE LEARNING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

Nurserv

Next week we will be reading the story Where's Spot and will continue to practise the prepositional words when we are playing. In Maths we will be looking and comparing two groups of objects using the following words to help us.

more, less, fewer, different, same

Reception Next week, our focus will be on celebrations and special family occasions. We will learn the story of the Christmas Nativity. Additionally, we will explore concepts of spatial relationships such as 'in front' and 'behind' with our Concept Cat. In Maths, we will compare weight and mass, learning about heavier and lighter, and understanding that bigger size does not always mean heavier.

- In English, the children will be writing their own version of 'Stick Man'. In Year 1 Maths, we will be looking at number bonds to 10. In D&T we will be tasting different fruits and vegetables and describing them, before designing our own smoothie.
- **English-** We will be writing our own version of The Flower Year 2 Maths- We are going to be using our knowledge of number when looking at money

Topic- In History we will be designing an old hospital and a modern hospital, discussing what is different and who helped make a difference. We are going to be very busy creating Christmas crafts.

HOMEWORK CHALLENGES

Please spend time with your child to explore this week's challenge. The teachers will talk to the children about what they have learnt at home every Friday.

Nursery:

Using a favourite soft toy, follow the adult's instructions where to put it. "Put teddy under the chair. Put teddy on the table. Put teddy next to/behind the plant". You could even try to play a twist on the game 'I Spy' but instead of guessing the word beginning with a certain letter, give clues as to the object's position, e.g. "I spy with my little eye, something behind the curtain" or "I spy with my little eye, something next to the plant".

Reception:

Compare the weight of some of your toys or weigh some pretend food. You could use your hands or kitchen scales. Draw a picture of what you have done or take a photo.





Year 1:

Please ensure your child has learnt their lines for our Nativity Play!

Do you know your number bonds to 10? Could you write the eleven pairs of numbers that add to 10? Do you notice a pattern?

Year 2:

Christmas is soon approaching and it is a time of giving and being kind- can you think of a way to do something for someone you know- you may make them something or do something with them.


