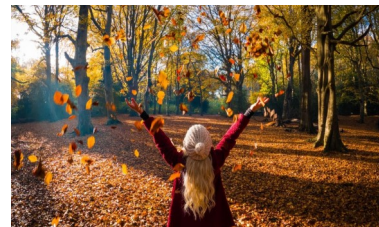

WHAT WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

Nursery We looked carefully at ourselves in the mirror and talked about our features. We then drew pictures of ourselves. Every Monday we have a session of sports outside with a sports coach. Please could your child wear a pair of trainers or sports style school shoes. Please avoid sending your child in plimsolls or ballet style pumps as these can be dangerous when the ground is wet. School coloured leggings or joggers would also be preferred on a Monday. This helps the children move safely and Comfortably. Thank you 	Reception  We had a fun and busy week exploring the new sounds: i, n, p, g, o! We also started learning about the Zones of Regulation, exploring feelings like happy, sad, angry, and worried. The children had a great time creating homes using construction kits and art materials. They drew pictures of their own homes and practiced tracing different images, improving their fine motor skills. In Maths, we focused on subitising and recognising numbers in different patterns without counting.
Year 1 In English, we unpicked our story of 'Handa's Surprise' through drama and answering questions. In Geography we learnt what an 'aerial viewpoint' was and made an aerial view of our classroom. 	Year 2 This week in Year 2, we've been very busy working hard across all our subjects! In English, we explored how to use expanded noun phrases to make our writing more exciting and detailed. In Maths, we've been learning all about place value and getting really confident with understanding numbers. In History, we discovered the amazing achievements of Florence Nightingale and how she helped improve hospitals. In Art, we continued our work on printmaking, experimenting with different textures and patterns. We also got our hands dirty in Science, planting bulbs and seeds as we learn about how plants grow. Well done to everyone for a great week! 

WHAT WE WILL BE LEARNING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

Nursery	The children will continue to talk about their sense of sight, we will read the story Brown Bear, Brown Bear What Can You See? We will be identifying and sorting objects by their colours.
Reception	Next week, we will continue to explore feelings like happy, sad, worried, and angry, and discuss ways to express these emotions appropriately. In Maths, we'll continue to focus on subitising. We will also compare 2 numbers and say which is more and which is less. We'll be sharing stories like <i>Peace at Last</i> and <i>Danny's Picture</i> . We will also be exploring the concepts of loud and quiet with our friend, Concept Cat.
Year 1	In English, we will be looking at how to correctly construct a sentence with nouns, verbs, capital letters, finger spaces and full stops using our text of Handa's Surprise. In Maths, we will be looking at patterns of numbers, such as subitising! In History we will be looking at sources that tell us about the history of our school.
Year 2	English- We are going to be innovating our class text together Maths- Continuing to explore place value (counting on and back) Topic- In Science we are going to be exploring the life cycle of a human. In Geography, we are going to be creating keys for a map. In D&T we are going to be discussing the purpose of vehicles.

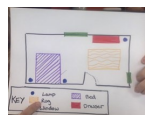
Reception:
