WHAT WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

Nursery

We have been reading the story 'Just Like Jasper' and have thought about if we had some birthday money to spend like Jasper what would we choose to buy. In maths we have been learning to use the words big, bigger, small and smaller to compare different objects.



Year 1

In English, the children have written their own versions of 'Handa's Surprise'. In Maths, we have been looking at how whole numbers can be split into parts using the part whole model. The children really enjoyed their local walk, they found lots of human features and spotted signs of autumn. The children also enjoyed a 'stay active' sports session.



Reception

We had a wonderful week exploring some new sounds v, y, w, z, and x. We also introduced the story of 'The Little Red Hen', during which children enjoyed activities including sequencing the story, and making their own bread. In Maths, we focused on understanding the concepts of more and less.



Year 2

This week in Year 2, we have been busy learning across lots of exciting subjects! In English, we've enjoyed reading and writing poetry, especially poems all about the weather. In Maths, we've been representing numbers in different ways and practicing estimating where numbers belong on a number line. In Science, we've been thinking about the wants and needs of humans, and in Geography, we explored the climate across the continent of Africa. During PE, we continued developing our handball skills, working on teamwork, control, and accuracy. What a wonderful week of learning!

WHAT WE WILL BE LEARNING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

Nursery

We will continue recalling and acting out the story 'Just Like Jasper'. We will be having imaginative birthday party celebrations with our friends, making playdough cakes, singing and dancing.

Reception

Next week, we will be revisiting all the phonics sounds we have learned so far. Our exploration of The Little Red Hen will continue as we create story maps to practise our comprehension and sequencing skills. In Maths, we will practise counting from 0 to 10 and begin to identify and order numerals in both number and word form. Additionally, we will celebrate Black History Month by exploring the artwork of Alma Thomas and will participate in a special Diwali Day celebration.

- We will be looking at autumn poems and continuing to look at the part whole Year 1 model in Maths. In History, we will be comparing old and new buildings in Watford. In Art, we will be making a final piece using our knowledge of line and colour inspired by Bridget Riley and Piet Mondrian. We will also be learning about why Hindus celebrate Diwali.
- **English-** We are going to be recapping over our grammar rules Year 2 Maths- We are going to be exploring numbers to 20 and using mental calculations

Topic- In History we are going to be producing some artwork by Alama Thomas for Black History Month. In RE we are going to be learning about Harvest Festival. In D&T we going to be learning about the healthy safety rules when using sharp equipment

HOMEWORK CHALLENGES

Please spend time with your child to explore this week's challenge. The teachers will talk to the children about what they have learnt at home every Friday.

Nursery:

When playing together at home with your child, ensure time is given to encourage your child to be involved and responsible for tidy up their own toys. Not all children know what 'tidy up' means so it is good to say "it is time to put things back where they belong". We also use a phrase when playing in Nursery 'Choose it, use it, put it away'.

Reception:

Practice writing the numbers zero to ten in words.

0 = zero, 1 = one, 2 = two, 3 = three, 4 = four, 5 = five, 6 = six, 7 = seven, 8 = eight, 9 = nine, and 10 = ten.

Year 1:

Year 2:

This week, your challenge is to become a poet! We've been learning all about poetry in class, so now it's your turn to create your own. You can choose one of these fun ideas:

Write a weather poem – maybe about a sunny day, a storm, or a windy walk!

Try a rhyming poem where the last words of each line rhyme (like cat and hat).

Create a shape poem – write your poem in the shape of your topic (a cloud, a raindrop, or even the sun!).

Practise reading your poem aloud with lots of expression – poets love performing!

Be as imaginative as you can – we can't wait to read your wonderful words and see your creativity shine!
