Thank you to everyone who joined us for our outdoor sing-along, it was such a joyful way to celebrate the children's end to the Autumn term. We are so proud of our wonderful children and all the amazing learning they've achieved this term.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Reception</p> <p>This week the children have made snowmen Christmas cards and Christmas hats, explored winter and Christmas books and created lolly stick Christmas trees. We practiced repeating patterns and wrote sentences about Christmas wish lists using the sound mat and Fred fingers.</p>

The children gave a wonderful performance of the Christmas Nativity, and we are incredibly proud of how confidently and beautifully they shared the story. In English, we had a mischievous visitor—Elvis the naughty elf—who has been causing havoc all across Year 2 and inspiring lots of fun writing. In Maths, the children have been revisiting prior learning and showing off their fantastic knowledge. In Science, we have been exploring bulbs and checking in on our ongoing bulb investigation. Year 2	<p>English- In English, we are going to be writing a recount of what Elvis the Elf has been getting up to in our school.</p> <p>Maths- In Maths, we are going to be using our knowledge of comparison to compare measurements (mass, length and capacity)</p> <p>Topic- We are going to be celebrating Hanukkah day in RE.
