Safety Corner

Official advice on how long children should spend watching TV or looking at computer screens will be available from the government in April. Government research showed around 98% of children under two were watching screens on a daily basis. Research also showed that parents and teachers reported that children were finding it harder to hold conversations or concentrate on learning. Please be mindful on how long your child spends on screens and what they have access to. If you allow your child screen time, please limit this time. Remember to have face to face conversations with your child so they understand about taking turns to talk and listening to each other. This is vital for their social and academic development.



WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

<p>Nursery</p> <p>This week we have enjoyed the story Goldilocks and the Three Bears we have identified and talked about the characters and how there were feeling within the story. We have explored frozen water and have been feeling ice.</p> 	<p>Reception</p> <p>This week, we explored children's prior knowledge about frozen lands and included activities like creating and melting ice hands using plastic gloves. We also wrote about how water freezes into ice and melts back into water. Additionally, we introduced the Gingerbread Man story and started making a story map. In Maths, we focused on sorting and classifying objects to help children understand properties and grouping.</p> 
<p>Year 1</p> <p>In Maths we have been looking at 'regrouping' numbers between 10-20 to understand place value of ten and some more. In English, we have used drama and answered questions about the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' to continue unpicking the text. In Art, we have learnt about our two new artists Barbara Hepworth and Franz West. In Computing, we have explored the effect of different tools on a paint program. In Science, we identified the basic structure of a tree.</p> 	<p>Year 2</p> <p>This week in Year 2 has been full of exciting learning across the curriculum. In English, we have been developing our comprehension skills by answering questions about a text and practising how to use apostrophes correctly in our writing. In Maths, the children have been using the expanded written method to add two two-digit numbers with growing confidence. In History, we were introduced to our new topic, The Great Fire of London, and discussed the timeline of key events. In Science, we planted bean seeds and are looking forward to observing how they grow and mature over time. During DT, we talked carefully about the importance of keeping ourselves and others safe when using tools such as a clamp and a saw. To finish the week, we enjoyed a relaxing yoga session in PE and practised our skills in tag rugby.</p>

WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

<p>Nursery</p>	<p>We will continue to build upon the children's learning connected to the Three Bears and will be encouraging them to recall and sequence the events in the story. We will be pretending to be the bears and practise saying key phrases from the story like "Someone's been eating my porridge".</p>
<p>Reception</p>	<p>Next week, we will make gingerbread men and continue working on our story maps and Gingerbread Man story sentences. For our topic, we'll learn about famous explorers, such as Scott of Antarctica. In Maths, we will continue sorting objects, creating sets where some don't meet any criteria and others intersect by meeting multiple criteria.</p>
<p>Year 1</p>	<p>In Maths, we will be estimating and ordering numbers to 20 using our understanding of place value. In English, we will be innovating the 'The Little Pigs' story as a whole class. In Science, we will be identifying and naming different deciduous and evergreen trees. In Art, we will be looking at pictures of sculptures made by Franz West and Barbara Hepworth and giving our opinions</p>
<p>Year 2</p>	<p>English- We are going to learning about subordinate conjunctions. Maths- We will be applying the expanded method to subtraction. Topic- In geography we are going to be researching facts about Antarctica. In art we are going to be using different types of line (crossed, cross hatch, stippling and smudging). In RE we are going to be learning about the Ten Commandments.</p>

HOMEWORK CHALLENGES


Please spend time with your child to explore this week's challenge. The teachers will talk to the children about what they have learnt at home every Friday.


Reception:
