WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

Nursery

We have continued retelling the story of Jack and the Beanstalk we are trying really hard to remember the order of what happens and have been incorporating our Makaton signs to help us. We have been planting our own beans and will be helping them to grow.



Reception

This week we used all of our literacy learning to create our own versions of The Enormous Turnip. We created story maps with different characters and then we will use this next week to help us retell

and write our own story.



Year 1


In English, we innovated the story of 'Tom and the Island of Dinosaurs', changing the characters to ourselves and the animal. In Maths, we learnt about the language of 'twice' with 'lots of' and 'double'. In Science, we looked at the characteristics of carnivores, herbivores

and omnivores. In PSHE, we talked about how to greet our friends.



Year 2

In English, we have been very busy innovating our version of 'Where the Wild Things Are' and using expanded noun phrases to make our writing more exciting. In Maths, we have been working hard applying previously taught knowledge to work problems. This week we wrote letters to King Charles III, explaining what we had done to celebrate the coronation and asked the King questions.





WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

- **Nursery** Next week in nursery we will be learning to use different measuring skills. How tall will a beanstalk grow, is a giant bigger than us? The vocabulary focus will be tall, short, taller, shorter, tallest, shortest.
- **Reception** Next week in Maths we will be focusing on teen numbers by using 10 and some more counters on the 10 frames.
- **Year 1** In English, we will be independently planning and writing our own adventure stories. In Maths, we will be looking at the language of sharing and working out division problems. In DT, we will be redesigning our moving pictures and thinking about changing the material they are made out of and the way we add colour. In Science, we will be having a mammal visitor come to visit!
- Year 2
 English: We will be taking part in a grammar week, revising over suffixes, compound words and different types of sentences.
 Maths: We are going to be exploring geometry
 Topic: We are going to be learning about the weather patterns of Jamaica

HOMEWORK CHALLENGES Please spend time with your child to explore this week's challenge. The teachers will talk to the children about what they have learnt at home every Friday.

Nursery:

The beanstalk was very tall. Can you find things in your house that is taller than you and things in your house that is shorter than you? You may like to plant some seeds of your own too.

Reception:

Ask a grown up or an older sibling to help you make ten fingers altogether. Working in a pair, show 10 fingers altogether. (e.g. you might show 6 and the other person show 4). Now find a different way to make 10 (e.g. 5 and another 5). Repeat.

Year 1:

Make a poster to show the difference between carnivores, omnivores and herbivores. Think about what carnivore or herbivore animals look like and what they eat.

Year 2:

Can you design your own bug hotel? Think carefully about what we learnt from the Veolia team about a bug's needs. You could draw your bug hotel and label it. As an extra challenge, you could then build the bug hotel in a garden or local park!
