Nursery Applications for September 2023

If your child turns 3 between 1 September 2022 and 31 August 2023 you can apply now for a place at our nursery for this September. Applications should be made using the online form on the school website under About Us / Admissions. You will be notified in March if your child has been offered a place.

We offer part time places (15 hours a week, either mornings or afternoons) or full time places (30 hours a week - available to parents who have a code from HMRC confirming eligibility). Children who joined the nursery in January after turning 3 during the autumn term will be able to stay for another year from September 2023 to July 2024. If you would prefer your child to attend a different session (e.g. move from afternoons to mornings) from September please inform the office. You do not need to submit a new application if your child is already with us.

WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

Nursery

This week we have enjoyed the story Goldilocks and the Three Bears and we have identified and talked about the characters and how they were feeling within the story. We have pretended to be the bears and practised saying key phrases from



practised saying key phrases from the story like "Someone's been eating my porridge". In Maths we will be classifying objects in different ways which helps foster children's thinking skills and they will need to make decisions about how things are or will be sorted. Language such as more, few, many, most, same, different and none will help the children to describe their sets/collections.

Year 1

In English, we started to unpick the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' by looking at using a question mark to ask questions and using the suffix –ed to change verbs into the past tense. In Maths, we continued to look at the place



value of numbers to 20 and matching representations. In Science, we identified the parts of a tree. In Art, we used Wassily Kandisnky's techniques of colour, line and shape to experiment in our own artwork.

Reception

This week we have continued with our learning about The Gingerbread Man. We were very excited to bake our own

Gingerbread Man biscuits, we worked together to add actions to our story and wrote words and even short sentences about some of the characters.



Year 2

This week in English we have been working hard on learning how to use apostrophes correctly to show possession. In Maths, we have been learning about statistics and different ways to

represent data. In ICT, we learnt about different ways to hold a camera/tablet to take photographs (landscape and portrait).





WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

- **Nursery** We will continue to build upon the children's learning connected to the Three Bears and will be encouraging them to recall and sequence the events in the story. This weekend will be the Chinese New Year, we will spend time next week finding out and learning about it. Within our Role play area we will have a Chinese Restaurant and to celebrate the Year of the Rabbit we will hopefully have a visit from a real rabbit.
- **Reception** Next week, we are continuing to explore our story, thinking about beginning, middle and end of the story, writing sentences about each part. In Maths, we are going to look at how many objects are in a group and thinking about how many in total (2 groups).
- **Year 1** We will be continuing with looking at 'The Three Little Pigs' and looking at the structure of sentences and the story. In Maths, we will be comparing numbers to 20 and looking at their magnitude. In R.E, we will be thinking about how we welcome different people to our communities. In Science, we will be thinking about the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees.
- **Year 2** English: We are going to begin to adapt the story of Jack and the Beanstalk by adding in our own characters and using our imagination.

Maths: We are going to be learning about written methods of addition.

Topic: We are going to be unpicking the events of the Great Fire of London and putting them into chronological order.

HOMEWORK CHALLENGES Please spend time with your child to explore this week's challenge. The teachers will talk to the children about what they have learnt at home every Friday.

Nursery:

Tell someone at home the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. What did Goldilocks do in the bears home? Try using different voices for the different bear characters. Also the bears like eating porridge, you might like to try making and tasting some porridge and adding different toppings – you could try fruit or honey.

Reception:

Lots of animals try to catch the Gingerbread Man in our story. Draw/write the name of your favourite animal. Could you write a short sentence about the animal?

Year 1: choose one option

Please have a look at the spellings and practise those. We will be checking these are being spelt correctly next week in our writing; or

Look at numbers to 20. Can you choose a number between 10-20 and show it in as many different ways as you can? Think about the part whole model, tens frames, tens and ones, the number name, the numeral, how many more than 10 is it? You can draw, take photos etc.

Year 2:

In Science, we have been learning about the properties of different materials. Can you take a look around your home and find objects that are made of different materials e.g. brick, plastic and metal. You could write a list of the objects you have found and the material they are made from.
