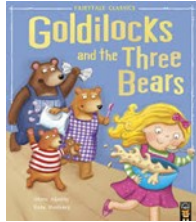

WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

Nursery

We have had good fun learning more about the story of Goldilocks and The Three Bears. We have also been identifying and sorting objects using the concepts hard and soft.



Reception

This week, we made gingerbread men and continued working on our story maps and Gingerbread Man story sentences. For our topic, we learnt about famous explorers, such as Scott of Antarctica. In Maths, we continued sorting objects and creating sets.



Year 1

In English, we have been learning about suffixes and understanding when to use plurals and the past tense -ed suffix. In Maths, we have been thinking about the place value of teen numbers when calculating 1 more and 1 fewer. In Science, we have been identifying deciduous and evergreen trees. In Geography, we have been finding out about the countryside and seaside in England.



Year 2

This week in Year 2, we have been incredibly busy and have worked very hard across all our learning. In English, we explored subordinate clauses, evaluated different parts of a story, and discussed the key features of a good tale. In Maths, we have been developing our understanding of subtraction by exploring the expanded method. Our Geography lessons linked closely with Computing, as we used our computing skills to research the fascinating continent of Antarctica. In Computing, we also practised inputting clear instructions to the Earls, developing our coding and problem-solving skills. In PE, we enjoyed learning and practising new yoga poses to improve our balance and flexibility. On Monday, we began preparing for making our vehicles by safely practising how to use a clamp and saw, and we created important health and safety posters to help keep everyone safe during our work.

WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

- Nursery** We will continue to build upon the children's learning connected to Goldilocks and the Three Bears and will be encouraging them to recall and sequence the events in the story. In maths we will be making repeating colour patterns. Can you make some at home?
- Reception** Next week, in English, we will be creating our own innovative gingerbread man story maps. We will also be enjoying a variety of penguin stories and labelling the different parts of a penguin. In Maths, we will focus on one more and one less, and continue practicing sorting and categorizing objects into sets where some do not meet any criteria and others intersect by meeting multiple criteria.
- Year 1** In English, we will be innovating and writing a new version of the story of The Three Little Pigs. In Maths, we will be looking at doubling and halving to 20. In Science, we will be observing seeds and bulbs and predicting what we think they will grow in to. In Geography, we will be looking at the human and physical features of London.
- Year 2** **English-** We will be innovating our class text together
Maths- We will be using our knowledge of addition and subtraction to solve problems
Topic- In History, we will be using sources to help us understand how the fire happened

HOMEWORK CHALLENGES

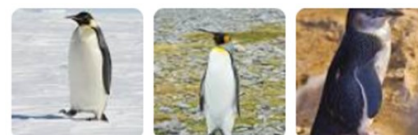
Please spend time with your child to explore this week's challenge. The teachers will talk to the children about what they have learnt at home every Friday.
