Welcome back to school! We would like to remind you of the school timings below:

8.40am - School Starts

8.45am—School gates close

3.10pm—School Finishes

Please note if you arrive after 8.45am you must come to the School Office to sign your child in as late.

Please ensure your child arrives on time for school every day. Arriving on time ensures that your child does not miss out on important learning that takes place at the beginning of the school day. Late arrivals can be disruptive to the teacher and to other children's learning, as it interrupts the flow of the lesson and can also cause increased anxiety for your child. If your child comes into school after the register is closed this is automatically an unauthorised absence and will count towards the threshold of a penalty notice.

# WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

<p><b>Nursery</b></p> <p>We have enjoyed meeting and welcoming our new children into our Nursery this week. We are looking forward to getting to know them and their families over the coming year. We have settled back into nursery with a winter time focus talking about the cold weather, snow and snowmen which we will continue.</p> 	<p><b>Reception</b></p> <p>This week we focussed on getting the children to write their holiday news. We also explored icy, frozen lands! We took part in activities like designing igloos, making snowflakes, and role-playing in imaginary frozen worlds.</p> 
<p><b>Year 1</b></p> <p>We have enjoyed welcoming the children back to school and spoken about our class rules. We talked about the new year and what we would like to do this year. In English, we predicted what story we would be learning with a straw house, a stick house and a brick house. In Maths, we have started to think about ten and some more.</p> 	<p><b>Year 2</b></p> <p>It has been lovely welcoming the children back to school this week and hearing all about what they have been up to. In English, we have been introduced to our new text Jack and the Beanstalk, and the children have enjoyed exploring the story and its characters. In maths, we have been learning about statistics, focusing on collecting and interpreting data. In RE, we have been discussing what is right and wrong and sharing thoughtful ideas and opinions. In art, we looked at the work of Picasso and Rozanova, using their styles to inspire our own creative thinking. In Geography we were introduced to our new topic 'Poles Apart'.</p>

## WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

<b>Nursery</b>	Next week we will be starting our new topic called 'Once Upon a time...' we will be reading lots of traditional stories, our first focus story is called <b>Goldilocks and the Three Bears</b> .
<b>Reception</b>	Next week, we plan to find out the children's prior knowledge about frozen lands and include hands-on activities like creating and melting ice balls. We will be making gingerbread men and introducing story maps. In Maths we will focusing on sorting and classifying objects to support their understanding of properties and grouping.
<b>Year 1</b>	In English, we will learning the text of 'The Three Little Pigs'. In Maths we will be looking at the teen numbers and the place value of ten and some more. In Science, we will be learning about the parts of a tree. In Art, we will be finding out about our new artists Franz West and Barbara Hepworth.
<b>Year 2</b>	<b>English-</b> We will be exploring comprehension questions on the text and looking at using apostrophes to possession <b>Maths-</b> In maths we are going to be learning about expanded addition method <b>Topic-</b> In history we are going to introduced to The Great Fire of London and learning how the fire started

## HOMEWORK CHALLENGES


**Please spend time with your child to explore this week's challenge. The teachers will talk to the children about what they have learnt at home every Friday.**

### Nursery:

### Reception:

### Year 1:

Can you make one or more of the three pigs' houses? Maybe you could make some puppets to help us act out the story!



### Year 2:

In geography we have been learning about the Arctic and Antarctica, can you research one thing that is the same about the places and one thing that is different? (Animals, weather, people, ice, land) - You may wish to present this as a mini booklet or a poster.
