# Early Years Foundation Stage - Reception

### Communication, Language and Literacy

- We will extend our vocabulary and learn new information about our world, through sharing rhymes, stories and non-fiction books with a focus on gardens, growing, mini beasts and animals.
- In phonics we will continue to learn and use 'digraphs' ch, sh, th, ng, nk, ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or, air, ir, ou, oy, when reading or spelling words
- We will talk about story settings, events, character and retell or make up stories using role play, puppets, and pictures.
- Make flap books, posters about minibeasts, animals, growing and instructions for looking after them.
- Make story maps sequencing familiar stories like the Enormous Turnip and Farmer Duck.
- Use the sounds we have learnt and red words to read and write sentences with independence
- Continue to work on letter formation
- Encourage emergent writing during our play egseed packets, price tags, cards, shopping lists.

### Understanding of the World

- We will observe a variety of life cycles such as butterflies, spiders, chickens, beans and seeds and discuss how they change over time.
- Talk about growth and change and learn the names of baby animals.
- Learn about different kind of animals and encourage children to ask questions to find out and learn more.
- Compare similarities and differences of mini beasts, anuimals (Go on a mini beasts trail in the local environment). Sort by criterias e.g. wings, no wings, fast and slow
- Think about how to care for animals and who looks after them eg: vets, farmers, zoo keepers

### Personal, Social & Emotional Development

- The Jigsaw Topics are about Relationships and Changes. Talk about Change and how it makes us feel.
- We will consider the consequence of our words and actions to others and ourselves. We will talk about what to do when faceds with a problem/conflict. (Play games as a family giving praise, talking about turn taking and any emotions that occur!)
- We will express our feelings in appropriate ways, having an awareness of our own needs and views and be sensitive to the needs, views and feelings of others. (Discuss how characters feel in stories)
- We will respect and look after our wild life and garden environment - mini beast hunts, gardening.
  (Use gardening tools and equipment safely)

## Our Garden and

### All Creatures Great and Small

### Physical Development

- Recognise the importance of keeping healthy and what we can do to help ourselves. (Go on family walks, bike rides, swimming, gardening and fly kites)
- In PE we will use small apparatus and practise control skills by pushing, patting, throwing, catching and kicking. (play ball games)
- Learn to use gardening tools when planting and looking after the Garden Area
- We will give the children the opportunities to develop their fine motor skills by cutting, painting, drawing and encourage handling tools, objects and construction materials safely and with increasing control. (Spend time drawing, cooking, planting seeds)

#### Maths

- Continue work on number recognition and formation
- Know numbers one more, less, inbetween given numbers.
- Counting confidently to 20 and beyond
- Understanding that numbers are made up of other numbers using subitisation.
- Rehearse and know number bonds to 5 then to 10
- Counting in twos, fives and tens.
- Explore and represent patterns within numbers up to 10, including evens and odds, double facts.
- Explore and solving problems involving doubling/halving
- Combining parts to make a whole, using the part/whole model to develop an understanding of addition
- Explore subtraction and finding the difference when something is missing within a part, whole model.

### Expressive Art and Design

- We will use our imagination in art and design by using different materials and paint. We will create various animals considering texture, shape, patterns and appropriate colours.
- Observe real paintings of flowers/gardens/snails and create our own versions.
- Observational drawings of real flowers, mini beasts (Have a creative basket/drawer at home so your child can be creative -go outside by taking paints, crayons, playdough into the garden!)
- Select tools and techniques to shape, assemble and join materials. (model making- explore ways to join materials)
- We will explore pieces of music and musical instruments and recognise how sounds change.
- Recognise repeated sounds, sound patterns and tap or clap rhythms to music.
- We will use our imagination in role play, stories and dance whilst playing camping, picnics, in our Garden Centre, vets and jungle explorer and small world mini beast and farm environments.
