WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

<p style="text-align: center;">Nursery</p> <p>We have been looking at chicks and how they hatch from eggs. We have been using paint and feathers to make chicks. We have looked at scarecrows and discussed what they are and what they are used for. Our number this week was 5. We have been learning to count and match up to 5, we also continued to look at phonic sounds. Concept cat has looked at 'same' and 'different'.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Reception</p> <p>This week the children have been working so hard with writing lots of wonderful sentences related to our story 'The Train Ride'. We have had lots of fun celebrating Red Nose Day and having discussions about why we celebrate it and why it is important. In Maths, the children have been really good at ordering numbers in the correct order.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Year 1</p> <p>In English, we wrote our own versions of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. In Maths, we looked at coins and their values and began to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. In History, we looked at a timeline of Queen Elizabeth II's life. We thought about her long reign and her significance as a ruler to our country and around the world. In D&T we looked at a slider mechanism. As part of our R.E learning, we had a visitor who explained how Muslims believe in caring for animals.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Year 2</p> <p>This week in school we celebrated Science Week. In Maths we focussed on doubling and halving, using multiplication and division. In English, we innovated our class text 'Little Red Riding Hood'. On Wednesday we discussed the Easter story. On Friday we discussed Red Nose Day.</p> 

WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

- Nursery** We will be introducing our new topic and finding out what we already know about 'The Three Little Pigs'. We will be printing and building with bricks, we will also be trying to get the little pigs back to their homes.
- Reception** Next week, in Maths we will be continuing with ordering numbers and estimating where to place them on a blank number line and explaining how they know. We will also be inviting children to bring in a bike or scooter to school. The children will be encouraged to talk about their vehicle and to ride it around the school playground. Also the children will be innovating 'The Train Ride' story by changing what they might see when looking out of the window of a train.
- Year 1** In English, we will be writing our own traditional tales. In Maths, we will be checking our mathematical learning of everything we have learnt so far! In History we will be learning about the importance of Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee. In D&T we will be designing our own Goldilocks and the Three Bears moving pictures. In PSHE, we will be thinking about the importance of cleanliness and keeping ourselves safe in the home.
- Year 2** Maths: We will be exploring multiplication
English: We will be innovating our own version of the text
