WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

Nursery

This week we drew cows and sheep as well as looking at simple patterns and the concept of 'under'



Reception

This week we have introduced our new topic 'Off We Go!' looking at various types of transport. We have introduced our new story 'The Train Ride' and the children have had lots of fun with all of the different activities focused around transport. In maths we have introduced children to positional and directional language, such as, over, though, forwards and backwards.

Year 1

In English we started to learn our next traditional tale of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. In Maths, we have been using our knowledge of the whole and part to solve problems relating to addition and subtraction. In History we started learning about Queen Elizabeth II and how her coronation. In Design and Technology we investigated the workings of different levers and what they are used for.

Year 2

It has been lovely to welcome the children back this week and hear all about their adventures. Thank you for bringing in your model houses! This week in Maths, we have been learning about the expanded subtraction method. In English, we were introduced to our new text 'Little Red Riding Hood. On Thursday, we were lucky enough to have a visit from the local fire station, we learnt lots of important ways to keep ourselves safe.



WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

- Nursery** We will carry on looking at and drawing farm animals, finger printing sheep with paint and focusing on the number 4
- Reception** Next week we will be continuing with the story 'The Train Ride', focusing on acting out the story and talking about the characters. We will also be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 7th March. In Maths we will continuing with positional and directional language, explaining routes and positions of objects.
- Year 1** Next week we will be celebrating World Book Week and looking at the character of Goldilocks. In History we will be looking at sources that show us evidence of the importance of Queen Elizabeth II, such as stamps and coins. In Science, we will be learning the parts of a flowering plant and checking on our Marigolds that we planted.
- Year 2** Maths: We will be exploring problem-solving
English: We will be looking at grammar rules
Topic: In geography we will be learning about the equator
