
Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 start at 8.55am (doors open from 8.45am)

WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK


Nursery

This week we have enjoyed the story Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We have identified and talked about the characters and how they were feeling within the story. We have pretended to be the bears and practised saying key phrases from the story like "Someone's been eating my porridge". We have also been identifying and sorting objects using the concepts hard and soft.




Reception

This week we have taken part in Gingerbread Man artwork and role played the story of The Gingerbread Man. We have used bricks and paint to design igloos and sorted hot and cold pictures. We have sung some frozen land songs and made snowy scene models. In Maths we sorted objects in a Venn diagram and we also counted objects carefully from 1 to 10.



Year 1

In maths, we have been busy working hard on doubling and halving numbers. In English, we have been exploring our new text and discussing what makes a good sentence. We explored the parts of a tree in Science and discussed what each part does.



Year 2

This week in English we acted out the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We learnt about coordinating conjunctions and used them in sentences. In Maths we recapped mental strategies for solving addition and subtraction calculations before moving on to adding 2 digit numbers and 10. In Art, we learnt about Olga Rozanova and Pablo Picasso. We looked at examples of their work and identified the line, colour and shape they used.



WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

Nursery

We will continue to build upon the children's learning connected to the Three Bears and will be encouraging them to recall and sequence the events in the story.

Reception

We will be playing with tuff spots full of Arctic and Antarctic scenery, with penguins, polar bears and other creatures who live in ice and snow. We will be looking at the life style of Inuit people and comparing it to ours. We will be making toy sleds for small world people to explore Polar Regions. We will be creating wax resist winter paintings. We will also be learning about the great explorer Robert Falcon Scott. In Maths we will be playing the value matching game.

Year 1

English- We are going to be innovating our class text.

Maths- We will be introducing the 'Think 10' concept.

Topic- We will be learning more about Queen Elizabeth's life.

Year 2

English- We are going to be learning about subordinating conjunctions and we are going to sequence Jack and the Beanstalk into 5 parts.

Maths- We are going to be continuing with our learning on written addition calculations.

Topic- We are going to be learning about the North and South Pole, labelling them on a world map and thinking about where they are in relation to the Equator. In DT we are going to be labelling the parts of a vehicle.

HOMEWORK CHALLENGES


Please spend time with your child to explore this week's challenge. The teachers will talk to the children about what they have learnt at home every Friday.
