WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

<p style="text-align: center;">Nursery</p> <p>We have had a wonderful week with the arrival of our chicken eggs, we all watched the chick pecking at the egg shell and watched the crack get bigger and bigger. This took a while to completely go around the shell, then the chick uses its body to push its way out. The chick hatched with wet downy feathers that were all stuck together. We now have 10 fluffy chicks, the light yellow ones are the boys and the brown ones are the girls. We have 5 of each. We were very lucky to have a sunny day for our sponsor bike ride, the children did really well and received their certificates, please start to collect and send in any sponsor money.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Reception</p> <p>This week children and staff have been very excited observing the chick eggs and have watched them hatch and we can now have little fluffy chicks. In Maths, we have been learning how to count on from an amount to find a total. Also this week, the children had the opportunity to go to the school library and choose a book to take home. Please can children have their library books every Wednesday so that they can choose a new book!</p>

In English we tried boxing up the story of Rama and Sita and changed the monster of Ravana to our own monster. In Geography, we identified the human and physical features of Belfast. In PSHE we thought about what it meant to be a good friend.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Year 2</p> <p>This week in Maths we have been exploring fractions of amounts and shape. In English, we have been innovating our class text together. In History, we have discussed why the UK needed help from the Common Wealth countries. We have welcomed some eggs into school which we are looking forward to see growing into chicks!</p> 

WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

- Nursery** We will continue to look after our chicks by observing them and talking more about their features and the life cycle of a chicken. We will also be introducing the story Jack and the Beanstalk.
- Reception** Next week in Maths we will be finding the missing whole and the missing part, using a variety of objects to help us. We will also be continuing to observe our caterpillars, discussing any changes and writing these changes in our caterpillar diary. HOMEWORK CHALLENGES

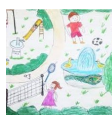
Please spend time with your child to explore this week's challenge. The teachers will talk to the children about what they have learnt at home every Friday.
