

WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

- **Nursery** Next week we will continue to learn about the life cycle of a chicken and will be focusing on the concept of big and little.
- **Reception** Next week we will be making some vegetable soup. We will also be looking at the life cycle of a caterpillar. We will be creating our own life cycles and various activities connected to the hungry caterpillar. We will also be looking at the life cycle of a sunflower from seed to flower and observing its characteristics like stem, leaves, and flower head.
- Year 1English- We are going to be innovating the class story
Maths- We will looking at multiplication to solve worded problems

HOMEWORK CHALLENGES

Reception:

Year 1:

Continue with project mentioned in last week's newsletter – 'Over the next half term in Science, we are going to be learning about different types of animals- these include, mammals, reptiles and birds. Over the next four weeks, we have a project for you to complete. We would like you to research your favourite type of animal. You may wish to create a fact file, mini book, create a 3D sculpture or poem (the choice is yours). When researching you may want to find out about their habitat, diet, what they look like, are they warm or cold blooded or any other fun facts. You have up until Thursday 22nd May to complete this- you can hand it in at any time.'

Year 2:

We have learnt about fractions 1/2, 1/3 and 1/4. Can you take photos or draw a picture to show you using these fractions at home or outside?
