WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

Nursery

This week we introduced our new topic 'People Who Help Us' we have started to focus on how we keep healthy. We have been using our new Doctors surgery role play and have been helping our toy teddies and dolls get better and keep healthy. We had a wonderful Tuesday in Nursery when the farm came to visit, we saw a donkey, goats, sheep, lambs, pigs, rabbits, large chicks, ducklings and a dog. We were able to touch, stroke and feed them. What was your favourite animal and why?

Reception

This week we learnt about animals and their habitat and we also matched animals to their young. In Maths we looked at halving numbers. In art we used sponges to make sheep pictures. We also looked at the History of Father's day and made Father's day cards. In playdough we made duck shapes.



Year 1

This week in Year One, we've been busy little learners! In English, we've been exploring non-fiction recount texts, and Miss Barton even played a few sneaky tricks on us during assembly to inspire our writing – it definitely got us thinking! In Maths, we've worked incredibly hard learning all about fractions, and we've been so impressed with everyone's focus and determination. In Science, we discovered fascinating facts about fish, especially how they use gills to breathe underwater. Meanwhile, in History, we used a range of resources to help us understand what happened to the Titanic – a real-life

event that sparked lots of thoughtful discussions. What a fantastic week of learning!

Year 2

This week in English we have been sequencing our model text into 3 parts; the introduction, the information and the conclusion. We have been learning about the suffixes —er and-est and how they help us to compare. In Maths we have been revising using the inverse to find a missing part of a calculation. We have also been recapping shape, using words such as vertex, edge and face to describe their properties. In Science we designed our own bug hotels ready to make them next week. We

considered what minibeasts and insects need in order to survive.



WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN SCHOOL NEXT WEEK

Nursery

Next week we will be looking at the people who help us such as doctors, nurses and paramedics. We will also be practicing for sports day which is happening on Friday. We look forward to seeing you to come and cheer us on.

Reception

Next week we will be writing some sentences about our story Farmer Duck. In Maths we will be learning about odd and even numbers. We will be investigating animal patterns and learning how to draw a duck in Art.

Year 1

English- We are going to be planning a recount Maths- We will be exploring fractions of shape

Topic- In Science, we will be learning about household pets and meeting Miss Barton's dog Nellie

Year 2

English- We are focusing on the skills of reading comprehension. We will be focusing on using the text to find the answer to questions and writing answers in full sentences.

Maths- We will be learning how to apply all of our learning to both mental and written questions. We will be unpicking how to show our working out when needed.

Topic- In Science we will be building our bug hotels using the designs we created this week. In Geography we are learning about the weather patterns in Jamaica and how they differ from the UK.

Nursery:


Regularly play the phonics game 'Mummy/Daddy Says'. Encourage your child to listen as you say the sounds (Fred talk) for the action words. Eg: Mummy says h-o-p, h-o-p, encourage your child to say it with you h-o-p and then say the whole word hop, complete the action together. Other word ideas could be Mummy says r-u-n, n-a-p, j-o-q, s-i-nq, h-u-q, s-i-t,

We hope you find this Parent Film helpful (set 1 letters) as it talks about how to say the letter sounds correctly when encouraging and saying the initial sounds heard at the beginning of words. .
