WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK

Nursery

This week we introduced our new topic 'People Who Help Us' we have started to focus on how we keep healthy. We have been using our new Doctors surgery role play and have been helping our toy teddies and dolls get better and keep healthy. We had a wonderful Wednesday in Nursery when the farm came to visit, we saw a donkey, goat, duck, sheep, rabbit, chicken and 1 dog. We were able to touch, stroke and feed them. What was your favourite animal and why?



Year 1

It was very exciting this week as we had 6 new additions to Year 1, some White Cloud Mountain Minnows (fish) have joined us! We have loved seeing them in their new tank! We have started our last History topic of the Titanic and found out what it looked like and when it was built. In English, we have learnt the text of 'Peter Rabbit' and looked at how many parts to find a half and quarter in Maths.



Reception

This week, we have really enjoyed hearing about what the children did during half term, lots of them having been drawing and writing all about their holiday news. We have also introduced the story of Farmer Duck and the children have started writing sentences independently related to the story. In maths this week we have introduced doubling.

HOMEWORK CHALLENGES

Please spend time with your child to explore this week's challenge. The teachers will talk to the children about what they have learnt at home every Friday.

Nursery:

Regularly play the phonics game 'Mummy/Daddy Says'. Encourage your child to listen as you say the sounds (Fred talk) for the action words. Eg: Mummy says h-o-p, h-o-p, encourage your child to say it with you h-o-p and then say the whole word hop, complete the action together. We hope you find this Parent Film helpful (set 1 letters) as it talks about how to say the letter sounds correctly when encouraging and saying the initial sounds heard at the beginning of words.

Reception:

Can you play a doubling game- roll a dice or select a random number of objects (from 1 to 5), can your child find the same amount and count the total to find the double?

Year 1:

Please see handout for another practise phonic check; this time can you draw the sound buttons and find the special and naughty friends in the words?

Tip: Use a hand to cover the end part of a longer word and blend each part before blending whole word together.

Year 2:

Next week the Euros 2024 starts. Can you pick a country you predict will win and create a fact file about that country?
